






Orchestra State Festival

Student Leadership: Kinard C.A.R.E.S. Service-**Learning Adventure Trip**

In April, our Kinard C.A.R.E.S. semester-long classes traveled to Catalina Island to participate in an environmental program off the coast of California. Kinard shares a vision of raising environmental awareness while making a difference in their local community. The aim of this class trip is to provide students with authentic and engaging learning experiences that reflect the civic responsibilities that the students will face as citizens in the real world.

While on the island, students engaged in an experiential-based outdoor learning curriculum that taught them important principles about the environment. Using one of the most diverse ecosystems on the planet as their classroom, students explored a local watershed and cove and climbed high mountain peaks to learn about healthy ecosystems and to develop interpersonal leadership skills.

While the trip was filled with recreation and adventure, it was far from a vacation. Students participated in a variety of service-learning projects to enhance the Catalina Island community. The primary objective of the service-learning component was an ongoing ecological restoration project designed to help protect the biodiversity on the island. Students removed invasive species and planted new native plants as a part of the regenerative process that Kinard students have been a part of for the past 15 years on the island. Another service project taught students about healthy food choices and composting principles while working in the organic garden on the island.

In addition to learning about sustainable environmental practices, students enhanced their leadership skills and personal growth through team-building activities that included ocean kayaking, hiking to and exploring Parsons Landing, and night snorkeling.

Give Next Awards Ceremony

The Give Next class formed their mission this year to support youth living in poverty who are suffering with mental health challenges. The Kinard students reviewed more than 30 grant applications from local nonprofits and collaborated by using a consensus decision-making process similar to Kinard's PLC model. The students raised an additional \$1,354.17 to meet a goal to fund the three nonprofits that they decided best align to their mission statement. With a total of \$6354.17, they awarded grant funding to Alternatives to Violence, Childsafe Colorado and Turning Point. The grant money will go directly to providing therapeutic services to children and teens in poverty who have mental health concerns from trauma, abuse, addiction and/or neglect.

At a ceremony in late April, the students honored each nonprofit by giving speeches about the importance of their work and then awarded the grant funds with oversized checks.

SRO Corner

As the weather starts getting nicer, we probably all want to get in our cars and enjoy the open roads. Here are some safety tips to remember when doing so:

- Always wear a seat belt. Why wouldn't you? Seat belts are the #1
 lifesaving piece of equipment built into vehicles today. They save lives!
 Make sure that those riding in the car, including young children, are properly installed and secured by their belts.
- Always travel within the speed limit and if the road conditions are hazardous, then go slower. Speed is involved in approximately 30% of all traffic crashes resulting in fatal and serious injuries.
- Set-up your infotainment systems before leaving on a trip. Technology is great, and every time we turn around, manufacturers are adding more to our vehicles. Be sure to set up your GPS, radio stations or other techy gadgets before you begin driving. That goes for your mobile device too. Turn on your "Do Not Disturb While Driving" setting to avoid using your phone when driving.
- Make sure your car is in tip top shape for traveling. There is nothing
 worse nor more dangerous than a breakdown on the road or a flat tire.
 If there is a breakdown, get away from the car. It is much safer.
- NEVER, and I mean NEVER, drive when you are impaired by alcohol or other drugs. Most people know when they have had too much to drink and if you don't, then always have a "sober" designated driver or an Uber ready. Much easier and cheaper than paying fines, lawyers, and increased insurance rates if you are caught. It is also safer than risking your life and someone else's because you decided to drive when you knew you shouldn't.
- Stay a safe distance behind the car in front of you no matter how many
 people cut in. The general rule is now a 3-second gap. During inclement
 weather, allow more time to safely stop for the conditions in which
 you're driving. The most important thing is that YOU DO NOT TAILGATE.
 You risk multiple car pile ups among other dangerous scenarios, so stay

as far back as you can. Of course, if you are using your mobile device, it doesn't matter how far you are behind that car, you are courting disaster.

Pull into a safe place if you are tired. Late night? Not enough sleep?
 Drowsy driving is just as dangerous as drunk, drugged, and distracted driving. The car is not your bedroom and you will be a much better driver if you keep them separate.

Kinard Health Office: End-of-Year Medication and Health Office Supplies Pick-Up

Parents/guardians, please stop by the health office to pick up medications/ health office supplies that have been stored during this school year. Medications <u>cannot</u> be sent home with your student. This policy is important to safeguard all students against improper or accidental ingestion of medication.

All medications & health office supplies need to be picked up before 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 30th.

Due to the number of medications in the health office and the process to sign meds out, please come in any time before May 30th to pick up medications. If medications are picked up before the last day of school, the needed number of daily pills can be counted out and kept in the original container at school or students that also self-carry can continue to self-carry only. If your student stored any health supplies in classrooms, please remind them to gather those from staff <u>by</u> the last day of school.

If you choose not to pick up the medication, our school nurse, Jena Gilbert, will follow state health department procedures and medications will be properly destroyed and disposed of after 11:00 a.m. on the last day of school. This includes ALL medications (Rx, EpiPens, all epinephrine injectors, asthma inhalers, baqsimi, diabetic supplies, etc.) not picked up before 11:00 a.m. on the last day of school. Medications & forms cannot be saved in the health office over summer break. Thank you for understanding.
