

# Every School Day Matters, Student Absences, and Early Pick-ups

Because regular attendance helps all students be successful, PSD has joined the state of Colorado in the state-wide campaign, *Every School Day Matters*. Students who attend school regularly perform better academically and are more likely to graduate from high school than students who are chronically absent (defined as missing 10% or more of school days, excused or not). Unfortunately, one in three Colorado students are chronically absent, according to the Colorado Department of Education.

The district's overarching goal is to reduce our rates of chronic absenteeism by 3.4% each year for the next three years to cut our chronic absenteeism by 50%. PSD also strives to reach 95% average daily attendance. While a goal of 100% attendance doesn't leave space for occasional student illness, going to school 95% or more of the time helps students stay on track with their schoolwork and feel more connected with staff, peers, and activities at school, which has positive impacts on student mental health and belonging.

If your child is ill and will not be attending school on a given day, please be sure to call in to our 24-hour attendance line at (970)488-5401. Please leave us your name, your child's name, and his/her student ID number. Even if you contact your child's individual teachers to notify them of the absence or to request make-up work, you still need to call the attendance line to confirm the absence with our office staff. You can also report an absence for your child via <a href="ParentVUE">ParentVUE</a>.

Additionally, if you plan to pick your child up for an appointment or early dismissal, please call our main office at (970) 488-5400 as early in the day as possible. It can be more difficult to get your child to you quickly if you wait to call until you are in the parking lot or immediately needing your student for dismissal.

With the assistance of our amazing 8<sup>th</sup> grade WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) Leaders, we welcomed approximately 285 6<sup>th</sup> graders on August 13. We also visited 6<sup>th</sup> grade ELOs last week to share how students can connect with us at school and online, as well as our role as school counselors and how we support students. Later this quarter, we will teach our SEL (Social & Emotional Learning) curriculum in 6<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms to support students' development of healthy relationship skills, which includes how to handle conflict or bullying situations. Visits to 7th and 8th grade classrooms to teach SEL curriculum and ICAP (Individual Career and Academic Planning) skills will happen in September and October.

#### 7th Grade Field Trip to Colorado Youth Outdoors

The PE department is excited to continue the annual Colorado Youth Outdoors (CYO) field trip for our 7th graders. This is an exciting field trip opportunity and partnership with the Colorado Youth Outdoors Program. 7th graders will go on the field trip for the whole day on September 18<sup>th</sup> (½ of 7th grade PE students) or



September 19<sup>th</sup> (the second ½ of 7th grade PE students). Colorado Youth Outdoors exists to build relationships through traditional outdoor recreation. All students will have the opportunity to rotate through four stations taught by trained professionals. At each station, students will learn about safety and will need to follow the instructor's guidelines in order to participate in the following activities:

Archery- on a professional range

Fishing- at various ponds on the property

BB Guns- on safe gun range using one pump BB guns

Survival Skills- learning outdoor survival skills

This field trip is to not only give our students an incredible opportunity to experience outdoor recreation, but also to introduce our upcoming archery and fishing units in the spring semester. This will meet many P.E. and Health Standards in the area of Prevention and Risk Management and Emotional and Social Wellness.

#### 7th Grade Spark Interviews

Throughout their time at Kinard, our school counselors work with students on creating their Individualized Career and Academic Plans (ICAPs). As part of the ICAP process, students at Kinard take inventories to learn about their personal learning styles and career interests using a web-based PSD program called Xello. Through Xello, students can compile and track academic and career plans throughout their middle and high school years.

In addition to the work that students will be doing in Xello, Kinard staff members will be conducting "Spark Interviews" with each 7<sup>th</sup> grader on Thursday, September 18 and Friday, September 19. Over the course of those two days, all 7<sup>th</sup> graders will also be attending a P.E. field trip to Colorado Youth Outdoors (see previous story). We found this to be a unique scheduling opportunity that would allow us to interview each student on the day they will not be attending the field trip.

The "Spark Interview" will ask students about their hobbies, academic interests, and vision for their futures. This will enhance the work students do through Xello by allowing each student to have a personal conversation with a staff member about his or her passions, interests, and potential future goals and plans. Our hope is to connect with each student individually and learn more about their personal "sparks" or areas of passion and how our school can support the vision that students are creating for themselves. The "Spark Interview" student responses will be utilized in future activities in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and for individual reflection.

Other topics that may be discussed in this committee include but are not limited to: parent involvement, student transitions, curriculum, instruction, assessment, systems for support, communication, technology, leadership, decision-making, positive behavior support, and school-wide capacity building.

#### **Standardized Assessment Results**

If your child took CMAS in a PSD school last spring, he/she will soon be bringing home hard-copy reports of his/her ELA and math results. In addition, parents/guardians of 6<sup>th</sup> graders will soon receive reports for students who took CMAS science assessments in a PSD school last spring. At the same time, we will send home hard-copy reports of fall MAP results for reading and math.

We also want to remind you that standardized assessment results are available through ParentVUE. After logging into ParentVUE, please use the following options from the menu of icons:

<u>CMAS</u>: PSD Documents (bottom row of icons)  $\rightarrow$  All assessment documents  $\rightarrow$  CMAS

- CMAS\_2025 (or other year) These reports provide information about your student's mastery of skills and concepts in the stated subject area.
- CMASGrowth These reports will be available soon and will show information about your child's growth as measured by the ELA and math assessments. Growth data will only be available for students who took assessments in both the current and previous years.

MAP: Student Information → Scroll all the way to the bottom to view graphs of your student's percentile rank on CMAS and MAP assessments (results available through spring 2025 for both assessments). For more information on MAP, please see the family guide <a href="here">here</a>.

#### **Helpful Procedures & Expectations**

As we start the school year, we wanted to share some helpful reminders to ensure a school environment focused on learning and student growth. We appreciate the support of families and our community to establish the conditions that help students feel safe and able to learn every day.

#### **Appropriate Dress**

Responsibility for the dress and appearance of students generally rests with the individual students and their parents/guardians. Student appearance should reflect pride in themselves when attending school and school-sponsored events. As stated in district policy, students must wear: a shirt (with fabric in the front, back, and on the sides underneath the arms); pants or the equivalent (e.g. a skirt, sweatpants, leggings, a dress, or shorts); and shoes (e.g. sandals, boots, or athletic shoes).

- Clothing choices need to allow for the participation in all schoolrelated activities (e.g. flip flops, Crocs, and sandals are okay for school, but students should bring athletic shoes when they participate in P.E. and health classes due to the activity level).
- Students who wear shirts with inappropriate statements or
  pictures that cause or have the potential to cause disruption to the
  learning of others will be asked to wear the shirt inside out or will
  be provided with another shirt if one is available. They may also
  call home and ask their parents/guardians to bring a different shirt
  or top.
- Hats or hoods that do not obscure a student's face or ears are permitted.

#### Drinks in Halls/Classrooms

We have noticed some students bringing "fancy" drinks, such as coffees and smoothies, with them to school in the morning and carrying them in the halls, taking them to class, or storing them in lockers. It is our policy that students consume these beverages prior to entering the building and to not bring them to lockers, the hallways, or classrooms to ensure the cleanliness of our building and a continued focus on learning in classes. Water is always permitted throughout the building. We appreciate your support in keeping our building looking its best!

#### Helpful Procedures & Expectations continued

#### **Food Deliveries**

We are also experiencing an increase in the number of students who are ordering lunch for delivery each day at school. We frequently have GrubHub, DoorDash, etc. deliveries to students throughout the day. While we realize these deliveries may happen on occasion for a special event, we ask that students do not regularly order food for delivery to the school. Deliveries often do not arrive on time for the student's lunch period, which then causes disruption to classes and student learning. Also, the frequency of deliveries places a burden on our front office staff who are already working hard to support students, staff, and families throughout the school day. Please encourage your student to pack a lunch from home or get a healthy, balanced meal from our cafeteria instead of ordering in food from local restaurants. Thank you for your consideration!

#### **Student Initiated and Led Clubs:**

If a student has an interest that lies outside of the listed school-sponsored clubs, they are welcome to explore starting their own club. Student initiated and led clubs are open to all students and can happen before or after school. Students interested in starting a student initiated and led organization must first meet with Mrs. LaRue to start the application process and to understand PSD policy around student initiated and led organizations. Students should come to that meeting with a general idea or proposal for their club - a description of the club, purpose of the club, when and where they would like the club to meet, as well as how frequently and for how long each meeting will run. Students will also need to find a staff sponsor who agrees to monitor and supervise the club.

#### **SRO Corner**

Hi from your friendly SRO Kate Garcia! Most kids call me Officer Kate. I am the SRO at Kinard, Bacon, Werner, and Zach Elementary Schools. Within Fort Collins Police Services, I am also a Crisis/Hostage Negotiator, on the Peer Support Team and on the Bike Team. Before I was a Police Officer, I was an EMT and got my BS in Kinesiology from the University of Rhode Island. In my free time, I love spending time with my family, playing hockey, fly fishing, and coaching softball at Kinard! Go Mustangs!!



With the coming of a new school year, your Fort Collins Police School Resource Officers wanted to take a moment to introduce our program. Our SRO program began in Fort Collins in 1995 as a result of a partnership between Fort Collins Police Services and the Poudre School District.

We have three basic goals:

- Provide a safe learning environment and help reduce school violence.
- Improve school/law enforcement collaboration.
- Improve the perceptions and relations between students, staff, and law enforcement officials.

Currently the FCPS SRO team is composed of 11 officers, 2 corporals, and 1 sergeant who oversees the SRO Program. These 11 officers have responsibilities for all 38 PSD schools within the City of Fort Collins limits. With our partners from Larimer County Sheriff's office and the Timnath Police department, there is an SRO representative for all 51 PSD schools.

We often are asked what we do as SROs, this can be summarized through the concept from the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) concept of "The Triad".

The three components of The Triad are Law Enforcement, Mentorship/Counseling, and Guest Speaking/Teaching.

These three branches make up a well-rounded School Resource Officer. During the school year, SROs can be found at their sites mentoring

students, offering advice about peer conflicts, or bullying. We may be found assisting in presentations in classrooms on a wide variety of topics. We also assist in traffic safety surrounding our schools through presence, traffic stops, and education.

We may be found in elementary schools reading to students or evaluating a science fair project. We may be playing hockey in PE classes or teaching bicycle safety and handing out stickers.

We also may be called upon to enforce the law in rare cases where students offend and harm others. These incidents can sometimes lead to direct referrals to community programs to repair harm, a Juvenile Summons to the Juvenile Court, or in extreme and rare cases, arrests. We also continuously collaborate with school administrators on a wide range of topics from drug and alcohol abuse, child abuse and neglect reporting, threats of violence to individuals or to the school itself.

Our SROs are carefully selected, specifically trained, and properly equipped law enforcement officers who are assigned to work in a school or school community in accordance with the NASRO standard.

Our SROs are always available for questions, and all have varied interests and expertise. We are available to support our schools and school communities as needs arise.

#### **IMMUNIZATIONS**

We have already received many immunization records for students this year- thank you for your timely turning in of these required documents! If you still have to turn in paperwork to the health office, please get those records in as soon as possible.

Students entering K-12 Grades must have the following vaccinations and provide documentation of the administration:

- Hepatitis B (minimum of 3)
- DTaP
- IPV
- MMR
- Varicella
- TDaP (minimum of 1)

If there are any reasons your student is NOT receiving one of the above vaccinations, please follow the link to the <a href="Poudre School District">Poudre School District</a> <a href="Immunizations">Immunizations</a> site, which provides the **non-medical exemption** and the **medical exemption** forms that must be submitted to the school.
