
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# Kinard's Global Leadership Travels to Costa Rica!

In late March, Kinard's 8th grade Global Leadership class traveled with EF Tours to Costa Rica. The group of 24 traveled to various locations throughout the country including San José, Sarapiquí, Arenal, and Guanacaste. During the journey, they took part in several different activities such as visiting a coffee farm, white water rafting on the Sarapiquí river, snorkeling, visiting a local hot spring, and much more. Students had the chance to serve the community by painting a school, cleaning up their soccer field and even played a game with the students. This taught students the importance of giving when you can, and that "we" is more important than "me." The students also got to go to a local market and learned about the vibrant Costa Rican culture and the basics of Spanish. The students were a little hesitant at first, but once they got comfortable, they almost became fluent. All in all, the Global Leadership class learned important lessons about culture, sustainability, "we" first and, thanks to the trip, they became a true family.

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### **Science O State Competition**



The aim of this class trip is to provide students with authentic and engaging learning experiences that reflect the civic responsibilities that the students will face as citizens in the real

world.


While on the island, students engaged in an experientialbased outdoor learning curriculum that taught them important principles about the environment. Using one of the most diverse ecosystems on the planet as their classroom, students explored a local watershed and cove and



climbed high mountain peaks to learn about healthy ecosystems and to develop interpersonal leadership skills.

While the trip was filled with recreation and adventure, it was far from a vacation. Students participated in a variety of service-learning projects to enhance the Catalina Island community. The primary objective of the service-learning component was an ongoing ecological restoration project designed to help protect the biodiversity on the island. Students removed

### **Give Next Gratitude and End of Year Report**

We, the students for Give Next extend our heartfelt gratitude for the generous donations from the Kinard community towards the class grant funding goal. With your donations and an amount of matching donations from Alpine Bank, we more than met our fundraising goal!

Our Kinard Give Next class set a goal of \$1500 for the year, but in total, we raised \$2213.06 to add to the \$5000 provided by our classroom donor. We were excited to learn this as it enabled us, in our grant-making decisions, to fully fund the grant requests from <u>Coalition for the Poudre River Watershed</u> and <u>Big Thompson Watershed Coalition</u>. Additionally, we were able to grant the remaining funds to <u>The Ember Alliance</u>!

To get to our decision-making process and reach consensus, we interviewed and conducted site visits for the nonprofit grant requests that align with our mission to fund organizations that are concerned for Larimer County residents and natural areas affected by natural disasters and habitat degradation as a result of climate change.

When we interviewed the Director of Big Thompson Coalition, we learned about issues still threatening the watershed from the Cameron Peak and Troublesome wildfires that ravaged the Big Thompson and Estes Valley areas. We learned about the various techniques this nonprofit is using to help with wildfire mitigation and forest restoration. In April, we went up into the Poudre Canyon into the heart of the Cameron Peak wildfire burn scar to learn firsthand about similar work being done by Coalition for the Poudre River Watershed. We observed where wildfire mitigation was done with mulch by helicopter, forest restoration, and continued efforts to protect the river as a source for drinking water for 300,000 residents along the Front Range. We also learned about the dangerous concerns with repeated flash flooding in the Poudre Canyon from a resident whose family survived the 2020 Cameron Peak fire but lost their historic 1885 home.

In May, we are holding our Give Next Award Ceremony to honor these nonprofits that we are grant funding. Thank you, Kinard community, for the role you have played in supporting Give Next and in providing needed relief to our residents affected by the fires. We are grateful!

# Kinard Health Office: End-of-Year Medication and Health Supplies Pick-Up

Parents, please stop by the health office to pick up medications/health supplies that have been stored during the school year. Medications <u>cannot</u> be sent home with your student. This policy is important to safeguard all students against improper or accidental ingestion of medication.

# All medications & health office supplies need to be picked up before 11:00am on Friday May 26th.

Due to the volume of medications in the health office and the process to sign meds out, please come any time before May 26<sup>th</sup> to pick up medications. If medications are picked up before the last day of school, the needed number of pills can be counted out and kept in the original container at school or students that also self-carry can continue to self-carry only. If your student stored any health supplies in classrooms, please remind them to gather those from teachers before the last day of school.

Our school nurse will follow state health department procedures and medications will be properly disposed of, if left in our office after May 26<sup>th</sup>. This includes ALL medications (Rx, epinephrine injectors, inhalers, diabetic supplies, etc.) not picked up before 11:00am on the last day of school. Medications cannot be saved in the health office over summer break. Thank you for understanding.

If medication is needed at school for the **2023-2024** school year, you may obtain new forms from the PSD website at any time. New forms are needed every school year and do not carry over.
