SRO Corner

Hello, and welcome to the second installment of the SRO Corner. This month we will be talking about Halloween safety and how to ensure you have a safe and fun Halloween. Every Halloween, there is an increase in accidents amongst children and adults. Those accidents can occur during trick or treating, hanging up Halloween decorations, and carving pumpkins. These accidents can be avoided by you and your children if you follow some of the safety tips below.

When trick or treating, wear something reflective. I know your children want to have a SPOOKY costume and don't want to ruin it with reflective tape. So instead place some reflective tape on the bag they are using to

store all the candy you score. Or have your children carry a glow stick or flashlight so they are easily visible. Another common way accidents occur on Halloween are children and adults falling and tripping over their costumes. To ensure this does not happen to you, make sure you are wearing shoes that fit. Also ensure your costume fits properly and is not dragging on the ground where it could cause you to trip.

Also, much like a lot of things in life, there is power in numbers. Ensure you are trick or treating in a group. Know the parents' names of the other children in the group as well. This way you can call them if your child has not returned home when they were supposed to and to see if their child has returned home yet.

As a parent, know your kid's trick or treating route. Prior to them going out, it is smart to drive the route your kids will be taking so you both are familiar. While driving around, designate a few landmarks as meet up points in case they get lost. If your child does get lost, tell them to stay in the same spot until you can come get them. It is much easier to find a missing child if they aren't continually changing where they are. If your child believes they are being followed, teach them the following:

- No- tell the individual NO
- **Go** Go away from the individual and somewhere safe
- Yell- Yell as loud as you can to get the attention of other people
- Tell- Tell the nearest trusted adult the situation so they can call for help.

Lastly, here are a couple tips for when you are putting up those Halloween decorations. Now, I know you may want to have the spookiest house on the block, but ensure you aren't overdoing your abilities. If you are putting up large decorations, make sure they are properly secured. Doing so will prevent them falling and potentially hurting you or your property. When hanging lights and using a ladder, make sure the ladder is on stable ground. Also, make sure you have someone holding the ladder to ensure it does not fall over.

Please follow these safety tips to ensure you and your children have a safe and fun Halloween.

PSD Health and Wellness Centers

Did you know that PSD has 2 health and wellness centers to serve our students? Locations are at Centennial High School and Lincoln Middle School. The Centers can provide medical, behavioral, and mental health services to any/all PSD students.

Services include:

- Prevention services, such as annual well-child exams and sports physicals
- Treatment of acute medical issues, such as colds, flu, acute illness and infections
- Management of chronic health conditions, such as asthma and diabetes
- Validated health needs assessments including screenings for depression and anxiety
- Counseling for mental health issues, skill development and resiliency building
- Health and wellness planning for adolescents
- Reproductive health care
- Prescriptions and in-house lab tests
- Health education and awareness campaigns
- Referrals to other medical and mental health professionals
- Vaccines/ immunizations (in collaboration with the Larimer County Department of Health and Environment)
- Dental screenings and services (in collaboration with community providers)
- Assistance with Medicaid/CHP+ enrollment (Centers are a Certified Application and Assistance Site or CAAS provider)

Costs based on ability to pay

The Health and Wellness Centers accept most private and public insurances, including Medicaid and CHP+. The centers offer fee-for-service and a sliding-

fee-scale based on federal poverty guidelines. No student enrolled is ever turned away for inability to pay for services provided by a school-based health center.
