#### **MathCounts State Competition**

#### **Kinard's Global Leadership Travels to Costa Rica!**

In late March, Kinard's 8th grade Global Leadership class traveled to Costa Rica for a service learning and adventure trip. The group of 22 traveled to various locations throughout the country including San José, Sarapiquí, Arenal, and Guanacaste. During the journey, they took part in several different activities such as learning about the history of chocolate in the Tirimbina Reserve, white water rafting on the Sarapiquí river, snorkeling, hiking up the base of Mount Arenal, visiting some geothermal pools, and much more. Students had the chance to serve the community by planting trees to prevent erosion on trails and doing service at a local elementary school that suffered a recent flood. The students cleaned up trash, painted walls, made planters, and played hours of soccer with the local kids. This taught students the importance of giving when you can, and that "we" is more important than "me." The students also got to try many local foods and learned about the vibrant Costa Rican culture and the basics of Spanish. The students were a little hesitant at first, but once they got comfortable, they almost became fluent. All in all, the Global Leadership class learned important lessons about culture, sustainability, "we" first and, thanks to the trip, they became a true family.



#### **7th Grade Fly Fishing Unit**

7<sup>th</sup> Grade PE students spent several class periods learning about the basics of fly fishing including how to put together a fly-fishing rod, tie knots, and cast, along with bug and fish identification. Our students will be taking the following required assessments for middle school grades this year:

- All grades will take the English/Language Arts and the Math CMAS assessments.
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade will also take the **Science** CMAS assessments.

All CMAS assessments are computer-based, therefore it is critical that students bring their PSD assigned <u>laptop and charger to school each testing day</u>. Please help your child to remember to charge his/her computer every night and bring the charging cord to school along with the laptop on CMAS days.

At Kinard, CMAS assessments will take place for most students on the following days/times. If your student has a plan that allows for extended time, that time will be added on to the end of the times shown below.

These schedules also include modified times for each class period. Students will also receive a printed copy of the CMAS assessment schedule during ELO on Monday, April 1st.

#### Additional CMAS Notes:

The CMAS assessment is designed to measure student mastery of Colorado's academic content standards. Colorado's academic content standards indicate skills and knowledge necessary to prepare students for success from early school readiness to postsecondary competencies, including both workforce readiness and 21st century skills. These tests provide valuable information for our school and teachers, who use the data to understand where students are in their learning and tailor instruction accordingly. The district also uses these results to measure overall student academic progress and identify opportunities for improvement. Furthermore, the *state assessments are a great opportunity for students to practice test taking skills, including how to approach an important test with a mindset that is calm, productive, and focused. We recognize that how adults talk about the assessments greatly influences how students view taking them, and we appreciate you joining us in talking about these assessments as a positive learning opportunity.*

These assessments also provide us with excellent information about your child's individual growth in each content area. Ultimately, CMAS is another very important way we, Kinard staff, get better. The data is invaluable. Our school is an amazing place and we want to continue to see it grow and improve.

- On CMAS assessment days, students will still go to their regular classes but on an alternate schedule.
- Students may bring reading material (sorry, no e-books) as they will be allowed to read or rest quietly after completing each assessment.
- For a successful CMAS experience, please encourage your child to get plenty of rest the night before, eat a healthy breakfast to fuel his/her brain, and bring a positive attitude to show what he/she knows.
- If your child is ill on a testing day, they should not come to school.
  Please continue to follow the <u>How Sick is Too Sick</u> guidelines, and contact our assessment coordinator to discuss make-up options.

#### **Opting out of tests:**

To excuse your student from state assessments, you may complete a Parent Excusal form digitally by logging into <u>ParentVUE</u> and accessing Services Tracker. Instructions and screenshots on how to do this can be found <u>here</u>. Please note that you will need to indicate you are opting your child out for each subject area. You may also print a <u>PDF version</u> of the form and return it to the Kinard main office. Spanish and Arabic versions can also be found <u>here</u>.

If you decide to opt out, you may keep your student home during our scheduled grade level testing times, and absences will be excused. We will also provide a study hall where students may sit quietly or read a book, according to state guidelines.

#### **SRO Corner**

Hello, everyone. I hope you were all able to get some much needed R&R over Spring Break. As the weather starts to turn nicer and we start to kick the winter dust off our bikes, the SRO unit would like to give a couple of reminders on bicycle safety.

First and foremost, wear a helmet! While a legal requirement for helmets does not exist in Colorado, according to the National Institutes of Health, the use of bicycle helmets was found to reduce head injury by 48%, serious head injury by 60%, traumatic brain injury by 53%, face injury by 23%, and the total number of killed or seriously injured cyclists by 34%.

Second, assume the driver of the approaching vehicle does not see you. The roads are, unfortunately, loaded with distracted drivers. Attempt to make eye contact whenever possible, especially at intersections. Colorado allows for "safety stops" at intersections, this allows bicyclists to ride slowly through stop signs without stopping as long as they yield the proper right-of-way.

Additionally, cyclists may proceed straight or turn right at red lights after coming to a complete stop if there is no oncoming traffic. However, youth ages 14 and under may NOT perform the safety stop unless accompanied by an adult. For more information, see Colorado revised statute § 42-4-1412.5.

Finally, always ride with the flow of traffic, never against it. Not only is it illegal, but it is also very dangerous as vehicular traffic does not anticipate bicyclists on the wrong side of the road.

Please remember, if you are riding on the roadway as a cyclist, you have the same rights and responsibilities as a motorist. If you are riding on sidewalks, you must follow the pedestrian rules while yielding to people on foot. We often see cyclists riding down the sidewalk and cross over intersections with no regard for vehicular traffic. This is, again, very dangerous and illegal. A pedestrian cannot "abruptly leave a position of safety."

Drivers, please be vigilant about cyclists on the road. Please do not park in any bike lane. Generally speaking, your vehicle should not occupy a bike lane unless you are setting up to make a right turn, in which case, you should position your vehicle on the "rightmost portion of the roadway." Doing so prevents a cyclist from attempting to overtake on the right as the vehicle turns right, creating what's known as a "hook" situation.


