




PSD Art Show

Registration for 2025-26 School Year

<u>Current 6th and 7th graders</u> will be receiving their registration materials for next year's courses between January 17-24. Parents will also be sent an email with registration resources by the end of that timeframe. **Course selection forms are due January 30 to the Student Services Office**.

<u>Current 8th graders</u> will be listening to presentations from our PSD comprehensive high schools on **January 23**. If your 8th grader is not going to one of PSD's comprehensive high schools, you may want to contact their high school for registration information. High school registration forms are to be **completed by February 6 when high school counselors will be here at Kinard to talk with students individually and collect those completed and signed forms**. 8th grade families received an informational email on November 16 that had additional information regarding transition to high school.

When the course selection materials come home for all grade levels, please encourage your student to read the course descriptions thoroughly. Registering for classes is a commitment and influences the development of the master schedule both here and at the high school. Making changes in the fall can be problematic.

SRO Corner: The Impact of School Threats

A school threat can have a significant impact on students, teachers, and families. Although most do not materialize into actual danger, it can cause disruptions in the school day for those involved. Kinard uses a collaborative effort when handling a real or perceived school threat. Although Kinard works to investigate a threat as fast as possible, it could potentially lead to substantial disruptions such as school closures or other strains on education.

What do we do?

 Education and Awareness: Kinard educates students on the seriousness of making threats and the potential consequences. Poudre School District uses the <u>Standard Response Protocol</u> provided by the 'I Love you Guys Foundation'. All schools in Poudre School District complete three lockdown drills within a school year and one fire drill each month. There are Standard Response Protocols posted around the school and in every classroom. Staff

members are also educated on the different Standard Response Protocols.

- Preparedness and Protocols: Schools, including Kinard, have clear emergency response protocols in place. We practice regular drills, update safety plans as needed, and partner with School Resource Officers to help ensure that all staff and students know how to respond in the event of a real threat.
- Encourage Reporting: A crucial step in preventing threats from escalating is encouraging students, teachers, and parents to report suspicious activity immediately. Whenever possible, we encourage reporting directly to a trusted adult at school, such as a counselor, teacher, or administrator to ensure the fastest and most complete response. However, Poudre School District also utilizes <u>Safe2Tell</u> for students to make anonymous reports. School Resource Officers and Administrators work with students and staff on any concerns or questions that might arise.
- Support Systems: Poudre School District provides mental health resources and counseling to all students, including those who may feel isolated or are struggling. There are also resources for staff members. Proactive mental health initiatives can reduce the likelihood of violence. Guardians are encouraged to check in on students, be active in monitoring internet use, and routinely check rooms, backpacks, and electronic devices for concerning content.

While threats to schools remain a concern, the collaborative effort between school officials, law enforcement, and the community is key in ensuring safety. Everyone plays a role in fostering a culture of awareness, respect, and accountability to protect our schools and keep our children safe.

Seal of Biliteracy

Did you know that PSD offers a Seal of Biliteracy for students studying World Languages?


Poudre School District honors students who speak more than one language by awarding them a Seal of Biliteracy on their high school diplomas. The PSD Seal of Biliteracy is a prestigious credential for graduating high school seniors who can read, speak, listen, and write at a high level in another language, as well as in English. The endorsement honors students who have studied another language, as well as those who have grown up speaking a language other than English.

Qualified seniors will also be recognized with an honor cord to wear at their graduation ceremony. The PSD Seal of Biliteracy endorsement will be documented on their official PSD transcript.

Kinard students who begin studying a World Language in either 6th or 7th grade may earn this award by their senior year in high school if they continue their World Language studies in high school. Students who speak a second language at home can also qualify for the Seal of Biliteracy. Kinard Give Next: Kickoff Day and Supporting Children With Physical and Learning Disabilities

On October 4th, our Give Next club went on a field trip to CSU for "Kickoff Day" and we learned about many nonprofits for needs that they support. With many other schools who participated in "Kickoff Day", this was a

powerful experience for our Give Next group. Some of the nonprofits we talked with are focused on supporting people with learning and/or physical diversity, food and shelter insecurity, and healing from abuse. We learned that many people are not as fortunate, and we have started our work in learning what we can do to help local nonprofits that support people with these needs.



After "Kickoff Day", we had a lot of discussion in our group to narrow down these many options to focus our support, and eventually, with every voice heard and considered, we voted on a mission statement for the highest concerns our group sees right now:

We, the Give Next group at Kinard Middle School are concerned and committed to making a difference to improve the lives of Larimer County youth with physical and learning disabilities.

*What is Give Next?

Give Next is a school-based youth grantmaking program for middle and high school students in Larimer County. Each class receives funding from private donors in the Give Next program for grant-making to award to local nonprofits. The students are also encouraged to



participate in fundraising to make a larger positive impact in their community. The year-long program begins with Give Next Kickoff Day, a day of information and inspiration. Back at their schools, students work together to identify community needs, choose a focus area, create a mission statement, research nonprofits, volunteer, conduct site visits, review grant applications, and make funding decisions. At the end of the school year, students award grants to selected nonprofits. Give Next is made possible through the support of many community partners. Primary program implementation partners are the Bohemian Foundation and the Community Foundation of Northern Colorado .

For all middle school sports, there are three things families must do to register their student for sports.

- Student athletes must be registered through <u>SportsEngine</u>,
- 2. Students must have a current sports physical on file at Kinard.
- Families must have paid the \$140 registration fee through <u>SchoolPay</u>.

Coaches will not be able to let student athletes participate in tryouts or practice without these three steps completed. For detailed information on how to complete each step, <u>please visit our registration page by clicking here.</u>

Girls Basketball - 7th and 8th grade girls

Team structure: Varsity, JV, C1 and C2 teams (limited roster/cut sport - up to 36 total players)

Preseason camp: Tuesday, 1/7 - Friday 1/10, 3:30 - 5:30 PM in the Kinard Gym

*Tryouts: Monday 1/13 - Wednesday 1/15, 3:30 - 5:30 PM in the Kinard Gym

Team practice: Starting Thursday, 1/16, 3:30 - 5:30 PM in the Kinard Gym

*Players must have a current physical on file, be registered through SportsEngine, and have paid the \$140 fee to participate in tryouts. For those players who do not make the team, the registration fee will be refunded.

Wrestling - 6th, 7th and 8th grade students

Team structure: Open to all students, non-cut sport

Preseason camp: Monday, 1/13 - Friday, 1/17

Team practice: Starting Tuesday, 1/21, 3:30 - 5:30 PM in the Kinard Auxiliary gym

Drop-off & Pick-up Traffic Safety Reminders

As the weather is colder and chances of snowy days are upon us, we wanted to raise your level of awareness as it pertains to drop-off and pickup procedures. Please remember that the traffic queue on Trilby Road is a moving lane. Please do not attempt to stop and wait for your child on Trilby Rd., as it blocks cars from entering the oval.

In addition, read the list below for recommendations for dropping your child(ren) off in the mornings. You can also review our comprehensive <u>Kinard Traffic Guidelines</u> that outline safe practices during the drop-off/pick -up process.

- Leave a little earlier to help avoid congestion on icy roads.
- Please always use the drop-off lane next to the curb only.
- No u-turns on Trilby- Please proceed westbound and utilize the round-a-bout if you need to turn back towards Ziegler Rd.
- Pull your car as far forward along the drop-off and pick-up lane before stopping your vehicle.
- Students should get out along the entire curb area. If you have come to the concrete sidewalk area in the oval, have your child get out and walk along the sidewalk.
- Please have your students ready to exit the car promptly. If your child is not ready to get out of the car, please pull into a parking stall. You can then use the crosswalk and walk your child in when they are ready.
- Students are to exit their vehicle only on the passenger side.
- Parents are to remain inside their cars- please do not leave your car unattended. Parking is not allowed in the drop-off/pick-up lane.

As always, we appreciate your attention to these matters and for helping us to create a safe and positive school environment. We need your help to keep the flow of traffic moving and our families safe in the parking lot. Every child's safety is important to us. It remains our highest priority to ensure that students enter and exit cars in a safe and organized way.
