

Registration Information

August registration is a very important event for Kinard families. Because it is important for students and their transitions and can be a rewarding social opportunity for both students and parents, we strongly encourage all families to attend in-person registration. However, we also offer an <u>online option</u> for families unable to attend on the scheduled days.

The registration days and times listed below are "drop-in" times; students and parents are not required to be at registration for the full time. However, we do request that a parent attends with your student. If you have students in more than one grade or cannot attend during the suggested date and time, you may choose to attend on a different day or time. However, please keep in mind these dates and times are designed to spread out attendees, so we appreciate your adherence to the specified time if at all possible.

Please park in the front (south) parking lot and enter through the main doors.

We are also seeking parent volunteers to help us run our registration events. If you are interested in volunteering at Kinard and available on any of the days listed below, please sign up here. If you are not already a registered Kinard volunteer, please complete these steps to ensure you are approved before August 4. At this time of year, it takes a bit longer for the district to process new applications, so we recommend you complete this process as soon as possible.

Friday, August 8 through Tuesday, August 12	Online: Make-up registration All grades	Online registration will also require bringing in new or updated health information, notifying us of any changes in student's information that can't be updated online, and turning in athletic forms. These in-person tasks can be completed from 7:30 - 2:30 on August 11 - 13. We appreciate completion by the first day of school so we can shift our focus to transitioning students.

This should only be considered an option if you have been out of town or otherwise unable to attend registration on the scheduled days.

During registration, parents will be asked to update information online, pay an annual contribution, drop off health and immunization records, register for athletics, and order yearbooks. Students will receive their class schedules and locker assignments and may access their lockers. School staff will be available to answer questions about schedules, athletics, and life as a Mustang. *We will not be taking school photos or distributing school laptops until after school has started.*

Here are additional details to help ensure a smooth registration process and an amazing start to our school year!

- **SchoolPay, Online Payment System:** SchoolPay is PSD's online system to allow families to pay for a variety of school-related items, including supplemental food items, athletic participation fees, annual contributions, field trips, and school-related merchandise.
 - ♦ To learn more about SchoolPay, visit the district's <u>website</u>.
 - ♦ To set up a SchoolPay account, click <u>here</u>.
 - Colorado's Healthy School Meals for All Program allows public schools to provide free meals to all students. There will continue to be a charge for supplemental food items.
- Kinard Contribution Campaign: In order to fund special projects and student experiences, we request an annual contribution for each student.
 - Read an <u>overview and letter</u> from Principal Lindsey Matkin regarding the annual contribution program.
 - You can make a contribution at registration by credit card, check, or cash. You may also participate ahead of time by using SchoolPay (SchoolPay may not be updated by the district until after August 1 so try again later if the site shows "item is unavailable"). You may avoid the service fee by making payments at registration.
- **Supplies**: Click here to see our supply lists for all grade levels. If your child is a 6th grader, we are asking for your help in organizing your child's binder and supply bag before the first day of school. Please use this wideo and/or this handout as a guide to help support our students and reduce their potential frustration when 30 students try to perform this task at the same time under the direction of 1 adult. If you have concerns about supplies or binder setup after watching the video, a staff member will be available at 6th grade registration to answer questions. Students can also ask questions on the 1st or 2nd day of school. 7th and 8th graders are also welcome to use the video as a general guide, but they are not required to organize their binder in the same way.

- Athletics: Click here for more information about athletics, the registration process, and required forms. The PSD athletics site is hosted by SportsEngine, and it will continue to be updated between now and the beginning of the sports' seasons. Kinard must have a current and valid physical release from a physician before students can start practice. Please bring a copy of your child's most recent physical so that your child is prepared to participate. We will have a representative available at registration to answer questions.
- Health and Immunizations: Please bring a paper copy of your student's most recent, updated immunization records and any documentation related to medications. Click here for additional information from our health office.
- Lockers: Students will be given locker information and are welcome to stock, arrange, and decorate their lockers during registration.
 Click <u>here</u> for guidelines for decorating lockers.
- Laptops: We will check out student laptops during the first week of school. Please review the 2025-2026 Student Technology and Computer Use Agreement & Tips for Caring for Your Laptop with your child and emphasize the importance of understanding and following these guidelines.

These are the required tasks to update/complete electronically. You may do this ahead of time, or we will have computers and someone to answer questions available on registration day.

- Student Individual Profile: Please log in to <u>ParentVue</u> and go to "Online Registration/Data Verification" in the upper right corner of the screen. Please verify that all information is accurate. You, as the parent, can edit emergency contacts. If you need to change your address or contact information, you can do that at registration or by visiting our student services office.
 - Information Release: One of the final screens in this verification process concerns information release (photos and interviews).
 Carefully consider the information release options presented toward the end of the verification process. We are committed to

honoring your wishes but have found this to be a frequently misunderstood request. It becomes a time-consuming process for us to check pictures against our list of students who have "do not publish" requests, so we want to make sure the list is properly updated. Please be assured we are not questioning your choice, just confirming it. Please see more information here.

- Name Pronunciation: It is important to us to learn students' names quickly and correctly. Especially if your child has a name that is often mispronounced, please consider recording the correct pronunciation within ParentVUE or StudentVUE. Once you have logged in and chosen a specific child, you can record the proper pronunciation using the audio icon near the student's name and picture. This can only be done on the mobile application and not on a computer.
 - 2025-2026 Students Rights & Code of Conduct
 - Click <u>here</u> to access Student/ParentVUE to acknowledge the PSD Code of Conduct.
 - Parents and secondary students must electronically sign and acknowledge they have received and read the Code of Conduct before gaining access to Student/ParentVUE for the year.

These are the <u>optional</u> tasks to complete electronically. You may do this ahead of time, or we will have computers and someone to answer questions available on registration day.

Skillman Photography Order Form: We will not be taking pictures during registration this year. Plan for school pictures on August 21, make-up pictures on August 29, and retakes on October 13. On these days, pictures will be taken of all students but ordering a package is optional. Use the school code KCMS2025 to order pictures on Skillman's website or by using this form. Please note that this code is not yet active on Skillman's website but should be very soon! Order forms will also be available during registration and in the main office.

Student Cell Phone Use at School

In accordance with the US Surgeon General's 2023 Report and in response to learning environment challenges caused by cell phone usage, Poudre School District implemented a Cell Phone Free Policy last school year. Kinard students, staff, and families reported overwhelmingly favorable responses to this policy and its positive impact on our school environment, including an increase in students' connections to each other and sense of belonging at school and a decrease in unnecessary distractions during learning time. We will be continuing to follow the same policy this year.

In accordance with <u>PSD Board Policy JICJ:</u> Student Possession and Use of Personal Communication Devices, the use of cell phones or any other electronic device will not be permitted during school hours at Kinard. Our

purpose is to ensure that students focus on learning and engage fully in school activities without the distractions caused by cell phones. We aim to create a productive learning environment that promotes academic success and personal development for every student.

Students will not be permitted to use or display cell phones during school hours. This includes classrooms, hallways, restrooms, and any other areas within the school premises. Cell phones must be turned off and out of sight. Cell phones can be stored in lockers or designated areas upon arrival at school and may only be retrieved at the end of the school day.

In case of an emergency, students may use the school office phone or request permission to use their cell phones under supervision. Parents needing to contact their children during school hours should call the school office at 970-488-5400 and messages will be relayed promptly. Meet Our School Resource Officer

Kinard's SRO is Officer Kate Garcia. School Resource Officers are certified police officers based at district middle and senior high schools. The goals of the School Resource Officer program are to:

- 1. Provide a safe learning environment and help reduce school violence;
- 2. Improve school and law enforcement collaboration; and
- 3. Improve perceptions and relations between students, staff, and law enforcement officials.





Kinard Traffic Expectations-

- 1. Thank you for obeying the speed limit on Trilby (25 MPH)
- 2. **No U-Turns on Trilby** Please proceed westbound and utilize the round-a-bout if you need to turn back towards Ziegler Rd.
- 3. Eastbound traffic on Trilby turning left into the south parking lot should fully merge into the center lane and yield between the cones ensuring that the thru lanes are clear at all times.
- 4. Please do not drop off or pick up students on Trilby or Ziegler Roads. Instead, please help our community to stay safe and minimize driver frustrations by picking up your child inside of our traffic oval, just outside of the main entrance to our school.

- 5. **During afternoon pickup**, please survey and **fill all parking stalls** in the south parking lot prior to queuing on the shoulder of Trilby Rd.
 - If you are waiting to pick up your child curbside, please make sure that your wheels are fully in the gutter as far away from the thru lane as possible.
 - Please do not stop your vehicle and wait to pick up your child in between the lines of parked cars. This creates an unsafe situation for children crossing in front of other cars driving in the thru lanes.
 - If queued on the north side of Trilby Rd., please move with the traffic entering the oval. Do not stop and wait for your child on Trilby Rd., as it blocks cars from entering the oval.
- 6. Please **do not enter the north parking lot** in the back of the school to pick up your children. This curb is marked for emergency vehicles and buses only.

Morning Drop-Off Expectations

Upon entering the Kinard oval, you will notice two lanes along the oval. If you are dropping off your child, you must stay on the outside lane. The inside lane is a drive-thru lane that facilitates afternoon pick-up and allows for parents to enter the parking lot for parking only.

Drive along the oval and as far west as possible, up past the music entrance, before dropping off students. If the traffic inside the oval comes to a stop, and you are next to a sidewalk, you will drop off your child, and they can use the sidewalk to walk to the main doors without risk.

Afternoon Pick-up Expectations

You may wait along either the Kinard oval, E. Trilby, or the south parking lot. School ends at 3:10 p.m. Many parents begin arriving at 3:00 p.m. Once you're parked and it is after 3:10 p.m., use cell phones to communicate your location with your child. As traffic begins to move, make sure you are moving with traffic entering the oval. Do not park and wait along the north side of Trilby Rd. as this blocks cars from entering the oval. Once you have picked up your child, you may use the drive-thru lane to move around the oval. No U-turns and electronic devices after the pick-up (safety first).


School Zone

For the safety of us all, please remember that Kinard has a **20 MPH school zone** running north and south of Trilby/Lady Moon before and after school.

Crossing Guards/Supervision

Kinard staffs four crossing guards, who are present at the intersection of Trilby and Ziegler in the morning and afternoon, to support students safely crossing the street. Please follow their directions to make safety the top priority.

Kinard staff will be present in the mornings and afternoons to supervise students, to help keep the process flowing smoothly, and to assist students and parents in crossing the street at the crosswalks leading into the south parking lot. Students need to be dropped off along the sidewalk where they do not have to cross the street when possible. Please remember that Kinard staff are not trained traffic directors, they are simply there to help facilitate student safety.



Athletic Game Parking – All parking for athletic games is located in the north oval and grass field. There is an access ramp that is marked by cones, signage, and personnel on most game days.

Bicycles – Students are encouraged to walk or ride their bikes to Kinard. There are bike racks available for students who ride to school. The bike racks are located on the south side of the school building on the sidewalk. We encourage students to ride their bikes to school and to wear a helmet.

School Lunches

We are excited to share that all students will once again receive **one free breakfast and lunch daily** in 2025-26 through the Healthy School Meals for All program! This statewide program started two years ago and is helping Colorado children and teens have access to nutritious food at our school. Students will still need to pay if they want additional, supplemental items (for example, bottled water). You can add money for these items to your student's account via SchoolPay.

Even though breakfast and lunch will be provided for free, we need families to continue sharing household income information through the Free and Reduced Meal Benefits form in order for our district to receive full access to federal funding. These additional funds will go directly back to Poudre School District to help cover the cost of meals and other nutritional programs. Plus, families who qualify may receive discounted school activity fees, community activity fees, utilities support and more! As always, all household income information will be kept confidential, and protected by law. Immigration, migrant, citizenship or refugee status is not required when completing the form.

Be sure to fill out the Free and Reduced Meal Benefits form as part of your back-to-school registration! If you have questions or would like additional support, please reach out to Child Nutrition at 970-490-3557 for more information.

- Free and Reduced-Price Meal Application: Families can apply online at https://www.myschoolapps.com/Application or pick up a paper application at your child's school. Applications must be completed annually to stay registered for the program. Your child's free or reduced-price meal eligibility status is confidential.
- Once approved for free and reduced-priced meals, complete PSD's
 Permission to Share Information for Fee Waivers and Programs to
 Receive Goods and Services Form. This form is available online
 through the PSD ParentVUE portal. Completing this form gives PSD's
 Child Nutrition Department permission to share your child's
 eligibility status with other district officials. These officials must also
 maintain confidentiality of your child's eligibility status. You must fill
 out the Permission to Share form each year.

Biometric Screening Information

- This will be the third year that all PSD schools will use a biometric scanning system in the cafeteria. The biometric screening system uses finger scanning technology to count how many students receive school meals; this count is required by the USDA. The system does not store a picture of a student's fingerprints and is only used to count meals served.
- Data collected is maintained locally by the PSD Information
 Technology Department, and none of the information in the system
 is sent externally or stored on the internet. Plus, the system helps
 ensure students get through lines more quickly to receive school
 breakfast and lunch both of which will remain free of charge this
 year.
- A parent or guardian can opt a student out of biometric screening by completing a form on ParentVUE.

Health Office News

This is an overview of required immunizations, immunization exemptions, ParentVUE, and any medications (if needed) for Kinard's health office.

At Kinard's registration in early August, please bring:

6th **graders**: A copy of your student's most updated immunization record to reflect having received the required **TDAP** vaccine <u>or</u> your completed immunization exemption certificate or form.*

7th & 8th graders: If you are new to Poudre School District, please bring a copy of your student's most updated immunization record <u>or</u> your completed immunization exemption certificate or form.* If immunizations were 100% complete for your student in 6th grade, you are most likely 100% complete for 7th & 8th grade.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Colorado law requires students who attend a public, private, or parochial kindergarten through 12th grade school to be vaccinated against many diseases vaccines can prevent, unless a certificate of exemption is filed. **Your student must be vaccinated against:**

- ♦ Diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap)
- ♦ Hepatitis B (HepB)
- ♦ Measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR)
- ♦ Polio (IPV)
- ♦ Varicella (chickenpox)
- Colorado follows recommendations set by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.
 - ♦ Students entering kindergarten must receive their final doses of DTaP, IPV, MMR and varicella.
 - ♦ Students entering 6th grade must receive one dose of Tdap vaccine, even if they are under 11 years of age.
 - If you cannot get in to see your doctor before school starts, you can also get the required immunization at Walgreens, King Soopers, and Costco, etc. For more information on immunizations, please visit the following links: <u>Tdap Vaccine Information</u>, <u>Colorado Department of Health and Environment Letter</u>, Poudre School District <u>Immunizations</u>
 - ♦ All recommendations are on the <u>Centers for Disease Control</u> <u>vaccine schedule web page.</u>
- Vaccines are recommended for hepatitis A, influenza, meningococcal disease, and human papillomavirus, but are not required.

IMMUNIZATION EXEMPTIONS

If you choose not to vaccinate your student with any of the required immunizations above, you must submit a new *nonmedical* exemption every school year starting July 1st and bring a copy of the completed certificate to

Kinard during registration in August. Visit https://www.colorado.gov/cdphe/vaccine-exemptions for more information and to download the certificate or to complete the online education module.

*There are **two** different ways to submit a **nonmedical** exemption to any Colorado school:

1. Submit the Certificate of nonmedical exemption **WITH** a signature from an immunizing provider who is a medical doctor, Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, advanced practice nurse or delegated physician's assistant.

OR

2. Submit the Certificate of nonmedical exemption received upon the completion of CDPHE's Online Immunization Education Module (print out). *If you submit a Certificate of nonmedical exemption on or before June 30th, it will not be valid for the upcoming school year.*

PARENTVUE

You can view most of your student's health record on <u>ParentVUE</u> on the website or ParentVUE app. If you have not accessed ParentVUE this school year, you will need to wait until August.

<u>In ParentVUE – under Health:</u>

- You can view <u>Nurse Visits</u> how many times your student has visited the health office.
- You can view <u>Health Conditions</u> anything you need to add/change here, you can do so at the beginning of the school year or anytime during the school year, and we highly recommend you update this information with us annually.

MEDICATION

Plans (HCAPS) under Quick Links on the right side. If your student is managing a specific health condition, you will find resources and required forms available in the specific sections as you scroll down the web page.

Medication Forms:

<u>Authorization to Administer Medicine</u> is a 1-page form used to have meds stored in the health office at Kinard and staff will administer daily or asneeded; if a HCAP applies (see the applicable conditions bolded below) – please turn it in with the authorization med form.

Health Conditions, Plans and Medications:

Self-carry is allowed and encouraged in middle school for emergency medications only, such as rescue asthma inhalers, EpiPens (or any Epinephrine injector), Benadryl, etc. (severe allergic reactions only), Baqsimi, seizure meds, etc. Some families have their students self-carry their med (backpack/locker/PE locker for after school activities, clubs, athletics, field trips, walking home, etc.) and store a second med in the health office.

<u>Carry and Self-Administer Asthma/Allergy Medicine</u> is a 2-page form for a student to self-carry their own emergency or urgent medications {pending nurse approval}. Please turn this in with the appropriate HCAP – every HCAP also has a **self-carry section/box that needs to be checked.**

- Allergies & Anaphylaxis HCAP
- Asthma HCAP
- Diabetic HCAP
- Headache/Migraine HCAP
- Seizure HCAP (not a self-carry box on the form, please use the Carry and Self-Administer Prescribed Medicine at School or School-Sponsored Activity form)

The self-carry medication **does not** get turned into the health office, just the med form(s) and a copy of the RX label. Kinard staff is delegated every school year to help or administer a self-carry EpiPen or any Epinephrine injector.

New health/medication paperwork is needed every school year (nothing is saved from the previous school year) and should be filled out by your healthcare provider and dated after July 1st. The completed paperwork (double check all the required signatures – front & back if needed) and medication (double check expiration dates {we cannot accept expired meds}) can be turned into Kinard's health office at the beginning of the school year.
