## **Fall Athletics- A Huge Success!**

Congratulations to all of our fall sports teams on a successful season! Our 300+ student athletes participating in fall sports showed tremendous dedication and work ethic, along with excellent sportsmanship throughout the season. We have had a variety of high character moments from all of our teams this year. Here are a few highlights:

- Our cross country team continues to define themselves by their high level of character in the Fort Collins community, and we continue to set records with the number of students who participate in cross country- 170 strong this year. Our boys team finished second and the girls finished third overall in the PSD championship meet. And then, in a true race to the finish, our girls varsity team won the Colorado Middle School State Cross Country Championship by one point, knocking out the highly competitive Webber girls team! Our boys varsity team also had a very strong showing at the state competition, finishing third overall.
- Our football team worked hard, showed great growth, and really hit their stride later in the season by winning some key victories. They finished the season on a high note with back-to-back playoff wins and a shut out win over Wellington to clinch the silver bracket championship.
- Both our girls and boys tennis teams won first place in the district championship! These athletes have maintained a program of excellence for over a decade, bringing home numerous championship titles, the most in Kinard's history.
- Our volleyball team finished their season as district champions as well! This great group of girls was fun to watch and consistently exemplified true teamwork and Kinard character on and off the court.





See below for a list of dates or visit each school's website for more details. We will also update 8th grade families as we learn of other registration events from the various PSD high schools.
- In late January, high school counselors will visit Kinard to help students with the registration process for 9<sup>th</sup> grade courses.

#### **Counselors' Corner**

As we continue to teach SEL (Social-Emotional Lessons) in each grade this year, we will be integrating Career and College Readiness skills into the lessons. This includes helping students develop their Individual Career and Academic Plan, also known as 'ICAP'. In high school, students will solidify their ICAP so they have an active and effective post-secondary plan. Below are the topics we are covering at each grade level in our first semester lessons:

- 6th Grade: Conflict Resolution Skills, Intro to ICAP & Learning Styles Inventory
- 7th Grade: Self-Awareness & ICAP; Interests Survey & Career Matches
  - Healthy Relationships Online (lesson happens in Tech Class)
- 8th Grade: Individual Skills & ICAP; Transition to High School

As students create their ICAP with us, all of their career & college readiness work and explorations will be recorded in their individual account in Xello, the career and college planning software program used in PSD. <u>Ask your child to show you his/her ICAP in Xello</u> and find out which careers he/she has identified as interesting. You can also explore Xello yourself and get a

#### **SRO Corner**

Keeping students and staff safe is always our top priority. Just as students learn academics step by step, we also take time to practice safety drills. We want everyone to know what to do and be able to respond calmly if the need arises. We understand that hearing about these drills can sometimes feel unsettling, but they are an important way we help students and staff be prepared and confident in any situation.

In Poudre School District, every school holds a monthly evacuation drill (what most of us grew up calling a 'fire drill'). Each school also participates in three lockdown drills throughout the year, with some schools choosing to practice more often. These drills are short, calm, and age-appropriate so students know what to do without creating unnecessary fear.

All of our schools follow the <u>Standard Response Protocol (SRP)</u>, developed by the <u>"I Love U Guys" Foundation</u>. This system uses common language, such as <u>Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, Shelter</u> – so staff and students know exactly what to do in different situations. Staff members in Poudre School District have had additional training in the SRP, and they practice regularly to ensure your child's safety is always a top priority.

These drills are about preparation, not fear. We want to help our students feel prepared and confident. It is like buckling our seatbelt... we hope we never need it, but it is there to keep us safe if we do.

Safety is a team effort! At home, you can help by listening to your child's questions after a drill and letting them share what they practiced. This helps students feel prepared and in control. Please reach out to me if you have any questions about our school's safety. We are here to help.
