#### 2024 CMAS Assessment Window

Please mark your calendars! The 2024 CMAS Assessment window is March 25<sup>th</sup> – April 26<sup>th</sup>. All students will take 3 English Language Arts assessments and 3 Mathematics assessments. Additionally, 8th graders will take 3 Science assessments. Please see the calendar below for a tentative schedule for when each of these assessments will occur. As you plan ahead, we would greatly appreciate you doing your best to avoid appointments or other student absences on these days.

The state assessment system, Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS), is designed to measure student mastery of Colorado's academic content standards. Colorado's academic content standards indicate skills and knowledge necessary to prepare students for success from early school readiness to postsecondary competencies, reflective of both workforce readiness and 21st century skills. Student progress toward these outcomes is measured through CMAS, which provides information to teachers as they incorporate the content standards in their daily instruction. CMAS results are also used for school and district accountability.

#### **Spring Sports**

#### **Student Supplies**

As we enter the last quarter of the year, we tend to notice that some students begin to run low on school supplies. Please check with your child to ensure they have sufficient school supplies left to help them finish the year successfully prepared for classes each day. The supplies we often notice dwindling include pencils, graph paper, and dry-erase markers. A quick check of your child's locker may even uncover some supplies they didn't even know they had!

#### Student Laptops: Bring To School Every Day and Plug In Every Night

Please remind students to **plug in their laptops every night** so that they bring a fully charged laptop to school every day. This will be especially important during CMAS testing.



Also, please have your child **restart their computer after March 12, 2024**, to allow it to process all monthly updates and be fully functional before returning to school on March 18. This will help your student to easily log into their laptop when returning to school after Spring Break.

#### **SRO Corner**

The School Resource Officer (SRO) Team is excited for March, and we are getting closer to spring! This month's SRO Corner will be on harassment and the Youth Police Academy.

What is harassment in the eyes of the law, as it has many categories in the Colorado Revised Statutes? The law starts with the intent to harass, annoy, or alarm another person, then it begins to cover several categories of harassment. The categories are touching another person, directing language or gestures at another person, communication online or through phones, calling someone at inconvenient hours, and taunting or challenging others. What's important for students and families to remember is that when it comes to harassment, the law looks at how the person who is being harassed felt, not what the other person may have meant. To avoid allegations of harassment, our suggestions include being kind to each other and remembering we all have different opinions, so it's important to be respectful, open-minded, and have empathy for each other. If all else fails, then find a trusted adult and ask them for help. It is also okay to turn off

your phone, unplug your device, or walk away from someone before they go too far down the path towards harassment.

#### **Thank You from 8th Grade Science**

Thank you to everyone who donated a dollar to offset the  $CO_2$  our paper roller coaster projects are creating in 8th grade science. Not only is carbon stored in the paper but additional carbon is released during the paper manufacturing process (harvesting trees, transportation, etc.). #### **School Transportation Safety Assessment**

Poudre School District staff is working with the City of Fort Collins, consulting firm Next Phase Engineering, and Safe Routes as part of a school transportation safety assessment. There are five schools, including Kinard, that are a part of the study this school year. The study will result in recommendations to improve traffic operations, infrastructure, and other variables to create better options for Kinard students who bike, walk, roll, or take transit to school. The study may also provide recommendations on optimal traffic circulation and management of motorized vehicles traveling to/from school.


