#### 7<sup>th</sup> Graders Participate in P.E. Field Trip & Spark Interviews

Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade class once again had the opportunity to participate in some fun and unique learning experiences this fall. Mr. Benson, Mrs. Jordan, and their P.E. students took advantage of the beautiful Colorado fall weather and some local resources to provide all 7<sup>th</sup> graders with an exceptional field trip experience at Colorado Youth Outdoors. Colorado Youth Outdoors exists to build relationships through traditional outdoor recreation. While at CYO, all students had the opportunity to rotate through stations, including archery, fishing, BB guns, and survival skills, run by trained professionals. At each station, students learned about safety and how to follow the instructor's guidelines in order to participate in the various outdoor activities.

While some 7<sup>th</sup> graders were on the field trip, we had the unique opportunity in the building to conduct "Spark Interviews" with the 7<sup>th</sup> graders who remained in their classes each day. As part of the Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) process, Kinard staff members personally interviewed every 7<sup>th</sup> grader to learn about their hobbies, academic interests, and visions for their futures. Our goal is to connect with each child individually to learn more about their personal "sparks" or areas of passion and how our school can support the vision that students are creating

#### **Parent/Teacher Conferences**

Kinard's Fall Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for **Thursday**, **October 10 and Tuesday**, **October 15 from 4:00-7:00 p.m**.

Conferences on both October 10 and 15 will be 5-minute drop-in style conferences in our cafeteria and gymnasiums. You can come and chat with any of your child's teachers without having to sign up ahead of time. In an attempt to balance lines and wait times for each evening, we suggest that families with last names A-L attend on October 10 and those with last names M-Z attend on October 15. We also realize that there is a cross country meet on Thursday, October 10 and encourage any cross country families to join us on Tuesday, October 15 instead.

Our School Resource Officer, Kate Garcia, will also be on site on Tuesday, October 15 to answer any questions you might have regarding her role at Kinard, student safety, or internet safety. Stop by her table in the cafeteria to learn more!

Parent/Teacher Conferences are a great way to meet your child's teachers, learn about your child's classes, ask individual questions about your child's academic progress, and gain insight into a variety of school resources to support your child's learning throughout the year. 
### **Student Picture Retake Day**

#### **Counselors' Corner**

**October is Futures Month:** We use October to look at interests, ideas for future pathways, and what is called ICAP – Individual Career and Academic Plan. Staff will have "Ask Me About" signs on their doors about the



colleges they have attended, there will be information shared about postsecondary options, and counselors will be working with students on ICAP activities using a platform called Xello. Students across all 6-12th grade levels in PSD use Xello to explore their ICAP. In addition, there will be daily announcements, a scavenger hunt, and we are <u>encouraging everyone to</u> wear their favorite college gear every Wednesday during October.

Parent/Guardian Info Session: Have you ever wondered how to get your child interested in a career pathway for the future or to support them in exploring graduating with options? ### **School Accountability Committee**

Our second School Accountability Committee (SAC) meeting will be held on Monday, October 21, from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. in the Kinard Media Center. The Kinard School Accountability Committee meets four times per year, approximately quarterly. The SAC is a wonderful opportunity to enhance our partnership with parents through an organized group composed of both parents and teachers at Kinard. The SAC has a very specific focus, established by the Colorado Department of Education and Poudre School District. Primary topics for analysis and discussion will include budget allocation and Kinard's Unified Improvement Plan (UIP). Other topics that may be discussed in this committee include but are not limited to: parent involvement, student transitions, curriculum, instruction, assessment, systems for support, communication, technology, leadership, decision-making, positive behavior support, and school-wide capacity building. #### **SRO Corner**

Welcome to the October SRO corner, where we will address some of the most impactful traffic safety issues as they relate to schools. For both parents and student drivers, safety in school zones is crucial. These areas have reduced speed limits, with speeds posted between 15-25 mph, to protect students during busy drop-off and pick-up times. Whether you're dropping off a child, sibling, or driving yourself, always slow down and stay alert in these zones. When a school bus extends the stop arm to pick up or drop off students, all vehicles in both directions must stop to allow kids to cross safely. Ignoring school zone speed limits or a bus's stop arm not only puts young lives at risk but can also result in serious fines or penalties. Stay focused and prioritize safety for everyone.

### **PSD Health and Wellness Centers**

Did you know that PSD has 2 health and wellness centers to serve our students? Locations are at Centennial High School and Lincoln Middle School. The Centers can provide medical, behavioral, and mental health services to any/all PSD students.

#### Services include:

- Prevention services, such as annual well-child exams and sports physicals
- Treatment of acute medical issues, such as colds, flu, acute illness and infections
- Management of chronic health conditions, such as asthma and diabetes
- Validated health needs assessments including screenings for depression and anxiety
- Counseling for mental health issues, skill development and resiliency building
- Health and wellness planning for adolescents
- Reproductive health care

- Prescriptions and in-house lab tests
- Health education and awareness campaigns
- Referrals to other medical and mental health professionals
- Vaccines/ immunizations (in collaboration with the Larimer County Department of Health and Environment)
- Dental screenings and services (in collaboration with community providers)
- Assistance with Medicaid/CHP+ enrollment (Centers are a Certified Application and Assistance Site or CAAS provider)

#### Costs based on ability to pay

The Health and Wellness Centers accept most private and public insurances, including Medicaid and CHP+. The centers offer fee-for-service and a sliding-fee-scale based on federal poverty guidelines. **No student enrolled is ever turned away for inability to pay for services provided by a school-based health center.**
