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#### **Orchestra Performs at National Festival**

The Kinard Symphony Orchestra performed at the National Orchestra Festival (NOF) in Atlanta, GA on March 21, 2025. They were one of 12 middle school orchestras from around the nation invited to perform for a panel of esteemed judges and clinicians. Additionally, they had a piece commissioned by Susan H. Day which they premiered at NOF in honor of Hal Kinard and our school's 20th anniversary. Other composers whose music they performed and who were present at the concert include: Deborah Baker Monday, Cameron Law, and Tyler Arcari. They also listened to many other middle school and high school orchestras from around the nation.

Our orchestra students also went to the Georgia Aquarium where they saw sea lions, whale sharks, and more! They attended a performance of the Atlanta Symphony, visited the Centennial Olympic Park, and Martin Luther King Jr's birthplace, including a "sneak peek" visit INSIDE the Ebenezer Church as they prepared for their morning worship service!

Additionally, prior to the trip to Atlanta, Mrs. Griffey and the Symphony Orchestra performed a Pre-NOF Concert/Clinic at Fort Collins High School. Not only were they able to receive feedback for improvement from guest clinician, John Hermanson, FCHS Orchestra Director, but they were able to play their pieces for some of the composers themselves, as well as family members of Kinard's namesake, the late Mr. Hal Kinard. What a special moment this was!

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#### **MathCounts State Competition**

The Kinard MathCounts team won first place at the Colorado state competition! The team made up of Neo Luo, Erika Tang, Joseph Lee, and Angela Wang earned the highest average score over the 4 rounds of the competition to take home the first-place trophy. We also had four students place in the top 10 in the state, meaning that they had to go head-to-head answering complex math questions in front of an auditorium of spectators. Yihan Jing (10th), Joseph Lee (9th) and Erika Tang (8th) all faced-off against each other to secure their rankings. Michael Luo and Thinh Le also competed at the state championships and did an amazing job in their two events. Neo Luo placed 3<sup>rd</sup> and will be part of a team of four students from several schools representing Colorado at the National MathCounts competition in Washington DC in May. Coach Alicia Williams will also be traveling with the team as the Colorado Team Coach. Way to go, Coach Williams and our Mustang

#### 2025 CMAS Assessments

We are so impressed and proud of the incredible work and effort our students have demonstrated this year. Both in and out of the classroom, Kinard students are excelling due to their dedication and hard work. We congratulate and thank our students for their progress thus far!

We will soon begin the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) state standardized assessments. All students in Poudre School District and the state of Colorado take the CMAS assessments. Please continue reading for scheduling details and more information about how our school community uses CMAS results to help ensure high levels of learning for all students and how preparation for and completion of CMAS assessments benefits students. We are proud of our students and our culture of positivity surrounding these assessments.

Our students will be taking the following required assessments for middle school grades this year:

- All grades will take the English/Language Arts and the Math CMAS assessments.
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade will also take the **Science** CMAS assessments.

All CMAS assessments are computer-based, therefore it is critical that students bring their PSD assigned laptop and charger to school each testing day. Please help your child to remember to charge his/her computer every night and bring the charging cord to school along with the laptop on CMAS days.

At Kinard, CMAS assessments will take place for most students on the following days/times. If your student has a plan that allows for extended time, that time will be added on to the end of the times shown below.

#### **Additional CMAS Notes:**

The CMAS assessment is designed to measure student mastery of Colorado's academic content standards. Colorado's academic content standards indicate skills and knowledge necessary to prepare students for success from early school readiness to postsecondary competencies, including both workforce readiness and 21st century skills. These tests provide valuable information for our school and teachers, who use the data to understand where students are in their learning and tailor instruction accordingly. The district also uses these results to measure overall student academic progress and identify opportunities for improvement. Furthermore, the state assessments are a great opportunity for students to practice test taking skills, including how to approach an important test with a mindset that is calm, productive, and focused. We recognize that how adults talk about the assessments greatly influences how students view taking them, and we appreciate you joining us in talking about these assessments as a positive learning opportunity.

These assessments also provide us with excellent information about your child's individual growth in each content area. Ultimately, CMAS is another very important way we, Kinard staff, get better. The data is invaluable. Our school is an amazing place and we want to continue to see it grow and improve.

- On CMAS assessment days, students will still go to their regular classes but on an alternate schedule.
- Students may bring reading material (sorry, no e-books) as they will be allowed to read or rest quietly after completing each assessment.
- For a successful CMAS experience, please encourage your child to get plenty of rest the night before, eat a healthy breakfast to fuel his/her brain, and bring a positive attitude to show what he/she knows.
- If your child is ill on a testing day, they should not come to school.
   Please continue to follow the <a href="How Sick is Too Sick">How Sick is Too Sick</a> guidelines, and contact our assessment coordinator to discuss make-up options.

#### Opting out of assessments:

Schools are required by the state to administer statewide assessments to students in grades 3-11 in reading, writing, mathematics, and science. Also, as required by the state, PSD has implemented a policy about excusing students from state assessments. To excuse your student from state assessments, complete a Parent Excusal form digitally by logging into <a href="ParentVUE">ParentVUE</a> and following these <a href="Instructions">instructions</a>. Please note that you will need to fill out a form for each subject area.

You may also print a PDF version of the "2024-25 Opt Out of State Testing Form" and return it to your school. Forms are available in <a href="English">English</a>, <a href="Spanish">Spanish</a>, and <a href="Arabic">Arabic</a>.

If you decide to opt out, you may keep your student home during our scheduled grade level testing times, and absences will be excused. We will also provide a study hall where students may sit quietly or read a book, according to state guidelines. Students may not have phones or computers in study hall.

#### **SRO Corner: Bicycle Safety**

Hello PSD families, it is hard to believe it is already April! This month, we felt it was important to discuss bicycle safety as warmer weather approaches.

As the weather starts to warm up, you are likely to see more bicycle riders to and from school. If your student rides their bicycle to school, please make sure that your student is taking measures to keep themselves safe! First and foremost, wear a helmet! Please ensure that your student wears their helmet and that you, as parents, demonstrate safe practices by wearing one yourself while on a bicycle or scooter.

While traveling on a bicycle or scooter, please use the bicycle lanes and travel on the right side of the road, going the same direction of traffic. While crossing, use the crosswalks and make eye contact with drivers before crossing to ensure that you are seen. We are seeing a lot of students that are wearing earbuds while riding. While this can make a more entertaining ride,

please remember that it is important to hear cars and other things around you. Consider using ear buds that allow noise around you or only using one.

As drivers, please be aware that there will be more bicycles on the road. Please remember that school zones are 20 mph and to be extra vigilant in these areas. Remember to take an extra look when pulling out of street parking outside of schools as bicycles may be coming from behind you.

## **Cyanotype Murals**

April 13, 15, 17, & 19

Using the sun's rays, create intricate monoprints from everyday objects! First discovered in 1842, cyanotype uses the sun's rays to reveal detailed silhouettes set against a field of Prussian blue. Make botanical arrangements out of leaves and flowers, design mandalas with stones and string, or bring your own unique items to add to the mural.

#### **Japanese Ink Marbling**

April 13, 15, 17, & 19

Suminagashi is the Japanese art of water marbling in which liquid sumi ink is dropped onto water to create beautiful marbled patterns, then prints are pulled on washi paper. Join us for an introduction to this process that's easy to learn, highly meditative, and remarkably versatile.

#### **Urban Sketching**

April 13, 15, & 19

Urban sketching is a great way to enjoy your community. You'll see, hear, and remember things about the experience that you'd never have otherwise. Do you have to have 'talent'? Heck, no! This isn't about making 'great' art. It's about seeing and engaging with your community in highly enjoyable ways. All you need is your 'adventurous spirit' when you join us and we'll provide the materials and simple instruction for you to take a first step into capturing the world around you through drawing and sketching.
